DISTANCE EDUCATION COURSES

TELEWEB COURSES - TeleWeb courses are designed to accommodate the educational needs of students who have access to and experience with a computer and the Internet and access to a television and VCR/DVD player.

WEB COURSES - Online courses are designed to accommodate the educational needs of students who have access to and experience with a computer and the Internet.

VIDEOCONFERENCING COURSES - The videoconferencing system is a network of classrooms connected by compressed-video technology. The classrooms are equipped with cameras, monitors, and other equipment that allows teachers and students to interact as if they are in the same room. Instructors can use traditional visuals, such as slides, videotapes, and overhead transparencies.

BLENDED COURSES - Blended courses require students to come on-campus for certain activities such as labs, presentations, or speeches. Students complete the lecture portion of the class without coming to campus.
